We are thankful for all of the opportunities the Lord provides us to minister through the Jason Paul Cameron Foundation. This year the Foundation has given back in excess of \$28,500.00 to continue our mission to share the love of Christ with others. We could not do this without you!

This year the JPC Foundation had the opportunity to participate in a community-wide event featuring Dr. H. Norman Wright, a nationally known expert in the field of grief, trauma, and crisis situations. Dr. Wright led sessions providing practical help to families experiencing grief. He also led training focused on responding to loss and crisis for area first responders, pastors, chaplains, law enforcement officers, and counselors. The JPC Foundation gave copies of the book *Good Grief*, as well as other grief recovery resources, to over 200 attendees at the event. We counted this as one of the greatest opportunities not only to minister directly to grieving families but to say "Thank You" to our area servants who respond in difficult times. We are forever grateful to those who walked that difficult road with our family.

Many young lives are touched through your gifts. We love the opportunities we receive to enrich the lives of our area students. This year, your gifts enabled the Foundation to provide college scholarships, Daily Evaluation Locker Cards to students at See You at the Pole, financial support to several area band programs, and Bibles and devotional books to over 100 students. It is also a great joy to help students attend summer camp and mission trips and grow in their faith or perhaps hear about Christ for the first time.

Our newsletter is published each November in memory of Jason on his birthday as our way to say "Thank You" for partnering with us in 2016–2017 to change lives. We hope the pictures we share offer a small glimpse of the ways your gifts are making a difference for the kingdom!


