As the new school year started, we provided our Daily Evaluation Cards to area schools for students at SYATP day. It always blesses us to hear parents tell about their children bringing their cards home and placing them in a prominent place to serve as a daily evaluation for them in their new school year. The Foundation supported area churches with a mentoring project to provide Bibles and devotional books to the football players at two local high schools. This continues to be one of our favorite projects - we love to see their faces as we place God's Word in their hands! We were saddened that many summer camps were cancelled but happy for the opportunity to support an organization that traveled throughout our state offering a summer program to tell students about Christ. We continue to provide grief resources to families who have encountered a loss during the year. The foundation looks forward to continuing to find new ways to support ministry opportunities as they arise.

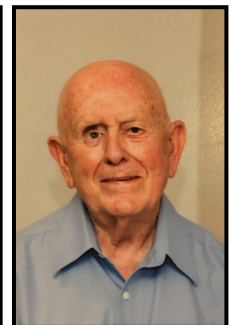
For the first time ever, our educational scholarship program had a drive-thru element to it as students dropped off applications! Due to COVID-19 schools closed just days before our deadline for the seniors to turn in their packets. This caused us to extend our deadline and come up with a new plan! This year we were privileged to meet most of these students in person (from a distance of 6 feet!) as they made arrangements to pick up their scholarship award from our front porch.
