What an incredible blessing it was to minister to so many during the 2020-2021 school year. Through your gifts The Jason Paul Cameron Foundation gave back over \$31,000 to others through our different areas of ministries. While some of our back-to-school projects looked a bit different with social distancing and face masks, we still were able to participate in our favorite ones that impact students' lives. We provided our Daily Evaluation locker cards to students attending See You at the Pole in hopes this simple tool encourages them to focus on Christ daily. We were excited to join with several churches through a mentoring project that provided Bibles and devotional books to hundreds of students at two area schools. It blesses us to know these students hold life-giving scripture in their hands. Our hope is to expand this project to more schools in the coming year.

It was very exciting to honor the 2021 graduates with \$15,000 in academic scholarships! Although much different than past years, we were able present the awards to the students in person with their parents watching. We look forward to seeing what the future holds for each student. This summer we were thrilled to provide once again over \$13,000 in funds to send students from our area to camps. We pray that by hearing God's Word that many, many lives are changed and students are led to Christ.

We continue to see the importance of supporting families facing loss of loved ones and friends. We hope to encourage and support them by offering the book *Good Grief*, a tremendous tool in understanding the journey they must walk through as they adjust and grieve. The Foundation provides these at no cost to area grief ministries, churches or other organizations that request our help, as well as to family members when the Foundation receives a memorial for their loved one.

Each November we publish our newsletter in memory of Jason on his birthday as a way to reflect on the importance he had in our lives and the lives of many others. We miss Jason
